1. **Rennau Herman Ross** son of Herman Charles Ross and Emmy Marie Sophie Rennau^[1, 2] was born on 02 Oct 1917 in St. Louis, Missouri^[1, 3, 4]. He died on 01 Jul 2008 in Austin, Texas, USA^[5].

remembers drinking beer at 16 to celebrate the end of prohibition

Their wedding reception was at Evelyn's parent's home at Eagle Park farm, as was the reception following their son Berni's wedding 30 years later.

Immediately after marrying they moved to 527 Marchant Place in Norfolk Virginia in Oakdale Farms, a Levitt development for Navy personnel. Just before the birth of Rennau Danforth they moved to Edwin Drive. Rennau was serving on the USS New York, training midshipmen and escorting convoys to North Africa.

In October, 1944 the USS New York was moved to the Pacific and Evelyn moved back to Eagle Park with Rennau Danforth and Bernard Clyde.

Rennau was discharged early in September, 1945 and they moved to Ithaca, New York so Rennau could go to restaurant school. They were too late to register, so they bought a house in Greece outside Rochester on Rye Street, and Rennau worked for the Powers Hotel. He tended bar at the hotel nights for special events.

In spring 1945 the family moved back to Columbia, Missouri. Rennau ran the ice cream parlor at Central Dairy, owned by Clyde Shepard and Dot Sappington. They lived in the little brown house.

Late 1947 or early 1948 the family moved to Glendale in St. Louis on Queene Anne Street. Rennau bought the Colony Gift Shop in the University Club Building in St. Louis.

Early 1950 the family moved to Albuquerque and contracted with Leon Watson for a house at 710 16th Street NW. Rennau went to work for Watson, after working briefly for Central Office Supply. They were in their new house by May, 1951.

In the spring of 1954 they moved to a house Rennau built on Kit Carson. Rennau was now in construction for himself.

They lived on Edith briefly before moving to 8636 Rolling Rock Lane in Dallas in 1957. Rennau worked for Butler Buildings and was vice president of the John T. Clark Company.

They moved back to Albuquerque in 1959, 42 Garden Park Circle, after briefly living at the Cavalier Motel.

In 1962 they moved to Falling Leaf Farm outside Columbia Missouri, and Rennau developed property on Eagle Park Farm.

In 1970 they moved to Rt. 1, Box 24A, Chillicothe Illinois.

In 1973 they moved to Santa Fe New Mexico briefly, then to Springer, New Mexico. They moved back to Santa Fe in 1975 when they bought the house at 463 Camino Don Miguel.

According to Rennau, Otto von Guericke was an ancestor.

Evelyn Joslyn Shepard daughter of Clyde Lindley Shepard and Ann Evelyn Joslyn was born on 18 Mar 1921 in Columbia, Boone, Missouri, USA^[6]. She died on 02 Nov 2000 in Santa Fe, Santa Fe, New Mexico, USA^[7].

She was Evelyn Frances Shepard, until the death of her younger sister Jane, when her middle name was changed to Joslyn.

Evelyn has the nickname "Peaches". Her cousin John Hanson wrote of her, "Back in about the year 1925, we 6 younger Grandchildren were sitting around the breakfast table with Grandmother Shepard (Myrtle), and she suggested that we play a game. She then went around the table, giving each one of us a nick name for some item on the breakfast table, such as sugar, cream, toast, milk, cereal, and PEACHES. Evelyn Shepard Ross was, from that time on and through high school, called by her nick name, Peaches. If I were to meet Peaches today, I'd still have to address her the same way. (This was included, just for your own enjoyment, plus giving me good vibrations.)"

From her baby book, written by her Mother:

On December 1 Evelyn Frances and Mother go to Columbia on the train to spend the day with Virginia Lee Hill. We arrived in the rain but Granddaddy was at the train to meet us so we did not care. We went out to Virginias in his car and were so glad to be there. All afternoon Evelyn and Virginia played together and had a fine time. Daddy came about six to take us home, but it was raining so hard we decided to wait until the next afternoon. Daddy came for us again and this time we went home with him. My! we had such a good time that we want to go again as soon as possible.

March 18. Evelyn Frances, Daddy and Mother get on the train at McBaine and start on a trip to Banpa Joslyn's. Evelyn was a good little girl. Her Daddy went as far as St.Louis, Bampa met us in Cairo and helped us the rest of the way. We liked Bampa and Bammass house so well that we stayed two months. Daddy came to see us at the end of the first month. That was fine!

Easter Sunday, April 4 1926. Mother, Daddy, Aunt Emily and Evelyn Frances went to church together. I showed her the programme and said "See the Angel?" She nodded assent and said "That is our little Janie - 'cause she is an Angel now."

Birth Notes:

According to her baby book she was born at 4:30 A.M., J.E. Thornton, MD, attending. 8 pounds, 12 ounces at birth.

Birth certificate reflects her changed name, Evelyn Joslyn rather than Evelyn Frances.

Although she was born in Columbia at Parker Memorial Hospital, at the time her parents lived in McBaine.

From her baby book, her Mother's explanation of how she was named:

The Baby was named almost the minute she was born - for the name had been all decided upon long before she arrived. The name given her is Evelyn Frances Shepard. Evelyn for her mother and her Great-Aunt Evelyn Danforth who died when she was a small child, and for whom Evelyn Frances' mother was named. Frances for Miss Frances Denny one of her mother's dearest friends and Baby's God-mother. Shepard for - well I guess for Daddy - since his name is that we decided it would be quite appropriate.

Her mother also wrote, On April 2 1921, baby Evelyn Frances, Miss Dorcas Lindsey, her nurse, Daddy, Mother and Aunt Hopie, who was just recovering from appendicitis, drove home to McBaine in Mr. Hudsons nice closed car. Miss Lindsay, Baby Evelyn and the colored chauffer rode in front and Daddy sat between the invalids on the back seat. When we arrived Grandmother Joslyn ran out and carried the baby in the house. It was almost six P.M. so the little girlie soon had her supper and was put to bed. Hence ends her first adventure in this big world. My her adventures all have as peaceful an ending.

Rennau Herman Ross and Evelyn Joslyn Shepard were married on 24 Aug 1942 in Columbia, Boone, Missouri, USA^[8]. They had 5 children.

2. **Herman Charles Ross** son of Bernard Joseph Herman Ross and Emily Jane Beer was born on 06 Dec 1888 in Macarthur, Victoria, Australia^[9]. He died on 05 Nov 1922 in St. Louis, Missouri^[10, 11].

Notes for Herman Charles Ross:

Returned to the United States in 1917 with Emilia. Son Rennau Herman conceived in Switzerland.

Death certificate shows residence as 1527 E. Grand Blvd. Work address as 1918 E. Grand. Says buried at Bellefontaine 11-8-1922. Emmy Ross was informant, but listed his father's place of birth as Australia and his mother's maiden name as unknown.

According to AMA, member, graduated St. Louis University School of Medicine St. Louis 1918, killed "when the automobile in which he was driving plunged down an embankment." "Claims he took work at U-Munster 1908-11; U-Kiel Apr.-Aug. 1911; U-Berlin 1911-12; U-Munich Apr. 1912-Aug. 1913. Exams June 5, 1914 (See letter from Dr. H.W. Loeb, Dean, St. Louis Univ. Sch. Med. 3/8/18)" high school and undergrad school: "St. Louis Univ. H.S.;B.S. '08, St. Louis Univ." Licensed to practice in Missouri in 1918.

According to a disposition he gave September 24, 1920, he had been practicing medicine since 1914, when he graduated from the University of Munich. He practiced in Germany and Switzerland for three and a half or four years after graduating. He began practicing in Missouri in July or August, 1918, in the neighborhood where his father formerly practiced, after graduating from St. Louis University. The deposition was taken in regard to a suit filed by Alice Snedeker against Parke, Davis & Company, and Herman C. Ross, after she suffered a reaction to an injection of Camphor Solution, Neutral. He treated Mrs. Snedeker for influenza and pneumonia in December, 1918. The plaintiff did not continue her suit against him.

According to St. Louis University Medical School, he matriculated in medical school on October 1, 1917 as a senior and graduated on June 3, 1918.

He is listed among the faculty in the Bulletin of St. Louis University School of Medicine, December, 1918:

In the April, 1920 issue of the Bulletin, he listed:

Therapeutics. Lectures and recitations three hours a week, second semester, Junior class, Dr. Ross. 1920 census schedule records 1879 as year of immigration (obviously wrong), 1896 as year of naturalization, address 1525 E. Grand, owned free of mortgage.

From Beermann Family History (translated from German):

"Hermann, my mother's brother, was born in 1888 and also wanted to become a physician. He was supposed to study medicine in Germany, not in the United States. For this reason, he was sent already as a student for longer periods of time in Germany, first to his uncle, who was chaplain in Haltern. There he attended elementary school and later the Paulinum in Münster.

"He remained an American citizen and was a graduate medical doctor when the war started. He could fill in for my father in his practice, because my father had to leave right away to the 'battlefield'. One day, the American Consul advised him to immediately leave Germany because of the imminent entry of the USA into the war. He picked up his bride Emmy Renau (sic) in Frankfurt, they got married in Switzerland and then left for St. Louis, where he practiced until his death by car accident in 1922.

"His three sons often visited us, sometimes alone or all together and sometimes attended the Odenwaldschule.

"Renau, the oldest, is architect. I saw him the last time during the Olympic Games in 1936. He lives in one of the southern states.

"Hermann, actually was my father's successor in his St. Louis practice. He died in 1978 due to a melanoid sarcoma shortly after a vacation trip to Germany during which he visited us.

"Berny, who had trained in a technical profession, was killed as pilot in the Korean War."

Physical description from passport application, 1916: 27 years old, 6 feet 2 1/2 inches tall, brown eyes, brown hair, prominent nose, normal mouth, round chin, dark complexion, oval face.

According to his passport application, 1916, resided in St. Louis from 1895 to 1908.

His draft registration card includes the note (I assume written by him): "On Registration Day this party was located in Lucerne, Switzerland and arrived in NY on 8/8/1917. Current in STL 8/11/17"

He died intestate, and his widow filed a plea that no Letters of Administration be issued. In this plea his estate was valued at \$661, including about \$311 in cash.

Citizen of United States.

From AMA: member, attended Kaiser-Wilhelms-Universitaet Medizinische Fakultaet, Strassburg, 1918 [date of graduation]; affiliated with Christian Hospital, and the Deaconess Hospital, where she died July 29, aged 63, of tumor of the brain. Licensed in Missouri in 1922, practiced in St. Louis and University City, Missouri. A note reads: "I married again ten years ago but continue to practice under the name of Ross. However, some patients who are personal friends know me as Emmy Ross Brockelmann 4-26-46." Failed at June 1922 Mo. Exam.

Returned from a visit to Europe on the Derfflinger, departing Bremen German, arriving Ellis Island, New York on 3 Oct 1923.

From the Korean War Veterans Honor Roll:

First Lieutenant Ross was the pilot of a F4U-5 Corsair fighter with Marine Fighter Squadron 212, Marine Air Group 33, 1st Marine Air Wing. On October 6, 1950, while on a combat mission 20 miles east of Suwon, Korea, his aircraft struck a ridge and crashed. First Lieutenant Ross was awarded the Purple Heart, the Combat Action Ribbon, the Korean Service Medal, the United Nations Service Medal, the National Defense Service Medal and the Republic of Korea War Service Medal.

naturalized in Victoria, Australia 29 Mar 1887

naturalized in St. Louis Missouri 8 Nov 1899 after, according to the certificate, residing in the United States for at least 5 years and in the state of Missouri for at least 1 year

received his Missouri certification 14 Nov 1895, it reports that he graduated from the University of Wurzburg, Bavaria 22 Jul 1882 (listed as J.B. Ross on certificate)

From Beermann Family History (translated from German):

"My grandfather Joseph, born 7.1.1857, instead of fulfilling his military duties, worked as a ship's doctor after finishing his medical examinations. He mainly travelled the South American route, his wage book is still in existence.

"After further clinical studies, he again worked on a ship, but soon settled down in Australia. There, he practiced in many places, but the longest he worked was in Melbourne. That also was his last place of work there.

"On 1.18.1888, he married there Emily Jane Beer, who was born on 11.22.1859.

"His practice must have been everywhere quite fruitfull, because at the beginning of the 1890s he made extended vacation trips to Europe with his family and also later, while in St. Louis. He left his children with his parents in Münster and also gave guest lectures in various university hospitals.

"My grandmother accompanied him and was often asked by new acquaintances if she was his wife, daughter or only his steady companion as she smilingly related later.

"When the economic situation in Australia worsened because of the "Big draught" and for other reasons, he suddenly moved to San Francisco in 1895. On 5.7.1895 his german medical title was approved and he received permission to practice medicine.

"Because there were too many Chinese living in San Francisco, he moved to another city (?), where the climate proved to be bad for his health. He then settled down in St. Louis for good.

"He died on 4.14.1908 in Münster due to a chronic kidney infection while on his way for treatment in Nauheim."

From Four Towns and a Survey:

"In the early 'eighties, Dr Ross began practice in rooms in the two-storey Commercial Hotel...."

In a letter from the Warrnambool and District Historical Society, dated 3/3/1933, Mary O'Callaghan wrote:

Here I must say that in 1890 when Dr. Ross resided in Warrnambool there was a land boom on, the railway was extended to Warrnambool and beyond from Melbourne and the new breakwater and pier was completed (after many years). It was the year when the last coach left the town and the first train came in. But in the mid 1890's all the banks failed and closed their doors, and there was general depression."

5. **Emily Jane Beer** daughter of Charles Chalker Beer and Emily Mahew Reed was born on 22 Nov 1859 in Balmain, Sydney, New South Wales, Australia^[25, 29, 30, 31]. She died on 09 Jan 1951 in Dusseldorf, Nordrhein-Westfalen, Germany^[28, 32].

Dad remembers seeing her at the 1936 Berlin Olympics

With her daughter Dorothy Blanche converted from Anglican to Catholic 3/20/1909 in Münster.

In the 1900 U.S. Census she is reported as "Ross, Beer", having been born in New Zealand, about 1862.

In her passport application in 1914, she states that she desires a passport for "identification and protection." Her reason for her German residency at that time was "the medical studies of my son", and that she intended to return to the United States when "my son who is at present assistant in the City Hospital at Frankfurt am Main finishes his studies as specialist for women's diseases". Her identification was certified by Frau Dr. Beermann.

From the St. Louis Globe-Democrat 17 Jul 1957 quoting a story dated 17 Jul 1907: "Mrs. L. Brandenberger and Miss Dorothy Ross, two St. Louis women swim stars, entered the first annual Missouri Athletic Club 10-mile swim meet, scheduled for August, and local AAU officials appealed to President James E. Sullivan of the National AAU for advice as to whether they could accept women's entries."

From Beermann Family History (translated from German):

"Dorothy (Dossy) Blanche Ross was born 10.2.1890 in Warnambool, Australia.

My parents were engaged in March of 1911, when my father, in his first year of military service, was a volunteer physician of the 2nd Westphalian Field Artillery Regiment #22. There were married on 1.18.1913 at eleven o'clock in the Liebfrauenkirche in Münster. The 'gala dinner' was held afterwards at 12:30 in the Monopol Hotel.

"An issue of the wedding news survived both wars.

"Since my mother just had turned four years old when she came to the USA, she was of course, educated in the American way. She always liked to remember the years in St. Louis. They lived there in a large house with a big yard, had enough help, naturally also a 'black mummy' as nursemaid. She often played tennis and was an accomplished swimmer.

"Even after my grandfather's death, the family wanted to remain in St. Louis. Only my brother Hermann was supposed to go to Germany for his studies.

"But grandfather's brother, the 'religious man', insisted that all should move to Münster. He did not want to again handle by himself the care of a very ill person. All of them had to get used to the provincial town of Münster after living for so many years in a big city. As far as I know, they accomplished to do it.

"The uncle's first deed was, that mother and daughter, who were baptised according to the rites of the Anglican Church which were also acceptable to the Catholic Church, were received into the bosom of the Catholic Church by bishop Hermann in Münster on 3.5.1909 according to permission #1735 and after giving the Tridentine testimony in front of three witnesses in the Überwasserkirche.

"She had to learn a lot, for example that a young lady never carries a parcel herself, because she won't find a husband.

"There were also funny mistakes with the language. After collecting all the necessary papers, in some cases all the way from Australia, she happily went to the Civil Registrar and asked him to his biggest astonishment: 'When will you marry me?' She wanted to say 'perform the wedding ceremony'.

After my mother survived the first World War unscathed and was well taken care of due to my father's peasant relatives, she remained at first in Düsseldorf and during the last two years in Everswinkel, the years of the second World War were very difficult for her. To the normal worries -- she still had three daughters to take care of -- came the early death of my father and also the notification, that my brother Dieter was missing in action.

"She spent many nice years after the war with her family and friends. She liked to travel and always was happy when she could be in Everswinkel, especially during canning time,

when she could be of use and help out.

Due to severe arthritis in the knees, walking became more and more cumbersome for her. Later she also had circulatory problems. She died on 6.5.1984 due to several strokes, 43 years after my father's death."

Johann Wilhelm Abraham Jaeger, founder of the well-known Jaegersche Buch-, Papier- und Landkartenhandlung [Jaeger book, paper, and map dealership] in Frankfurt am Main, was born on August 18, 1718, in Nürnberg, son of the city quartermaster there. Young Jaeger chose a military career, entered the service of Austria in 1737, and participated in the campaigns of 1742 and 1744. After the death of Emperor Carl VII, he left Austria, intending to join the standing army under Prince Karl of Lorraine. On traveling through to Heidelberg, he stopped off in Frankfurt and on the recommendation of several citizens with whom he happened to come in contact, he enlisted for service in Frankfurt. He was also accepted by Goethe's grandfather, then deputy of the ordnance office, as artillery gunner. In 1748 he left this service and moved to Hanau, where he ran a powder factory until he was called back to Frankfurt in 1757 as master of the ordnance.

In 1762 Jaeger purchased the Hutter book shop on the Pfarreisen, established ca. 1690, for the sum of 11,008 gulden and turned its operation over to his wife. He himself did not remain idle but started work on the well-known Jaeger Atlas of Germany in 81 sheets, as geographer, draftsman, and publisher all in one. The atlas brought him success and was also in great demand later during the Napoleonic war years. As late as his 41st year, Jaeger learned the French language. Soon thereafter he appears as translator of LeBlond's four-volume work Kriegskunst [known as Elements of War in English].
